PROPOSITION C

Shall Magna Water District, Utah, be authorized to issue General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed Twenty-Two Million Dollars (\$22,000,000) (the "Bonds") for the purpose of paying all or a portion of the costs of various capital improvements to its culinary water, secondary water, and wastewater systems, and all related improvements? Said Bonds to mature in not to exceed twenty-four (24) years from the date of issuance of such Bonds.

<u>Property Tax Cost of Bonds</u>. A general obligation bond is a debt owed by government. The government uses tax revenue to pay for the debt. The District has other outstanding general obligation bonds for which a tax decrease would occur upon the retirement of such bonds (which may not occur if the Bonds are issued). However, these outstanding bonds mature and pay off over time such that no incremental property tax increase from the District's 2016 general obligation bond tax revenue requirements is expected due to the issuance of these Bonds on residences and businesses within the District.

If these Bonds are issued as planned (and without regard to the existing taxes currently paid for existing bonds that will mature and pay off over time), a property tax to pay debt service on the Bonds will be required over a period of twenty-four (24) years in the estimated amount of \$105 per year on a \$160,000 residence and in the estimated amount of \$191 per year on a business property having the same value.

The foregoing information is only an estimate and is not a limit on the amount of taxes that the District may be required to levy in order to pay debt service on the Bonds. The District is obligated to levy taxes to the extent provided by law in order to pay the Bonds. The amounts are based on various assumptions and estimates, including estimated debt service on the Bonds and taxable values of property in the District.

Voting at the special bond election shall be conducted entirely by absentee ballot. Ballots will be mailed to all registered voters in the District beginning October 11, 2016. Absentee ballots must be postmarked before election day or delivered in person by 8:00 p.m. on election day to the Salt Lake County Offices, 2001 South State Street, Suite S1-200, in Salt Lake City, Utah. Voters wishing to vote by absentee ballot and who fail to receive a ballot in the mail may contact the Salt Lake County Clerk's office by phone at (385) 468-8683.

Pursuant to applicable provisions of Utah State law, the period allowed for any contest of the Bond Election shall end forty (40) days after November 22, 2016 (the date on which the returns of the Bond Election are to be canvassed and the results thereof declared). No such contest shall be maintained unless a complaint meeting the requirements of applicable law is filed with the Clerk of the District Court of Salt Lake County within the prescribed forty (40) day period.
